** Minimum scores required on the TOEFL Internet based Test (TOEFL iBT) are: Writing test:24 (out of 30); Speaking test: 22 (out of 30); Reading test: 22 (out of 30);

**Listening test: 20 (out of 30), for a TOEFL iBT minimum TOTAL SCORE: 88 (out of 120). Applicants must have the minimum score in each test, as well as the minimum overall score.
